So it was time once more to dust off my second-hand racing suit and pit myself, on behalf of Surrey Life, against some of the UK's best racing drivers and keen amateur karting folk from various local businesses - all in aid of a wonderful charity; happy days!

and how we came 17th out of some 30 teams; not bad at all, we felt, for our hastily assembled motley crew! Suffice to say, the competition was intense, and clearly the teams that had bid donations to the halow project to have a pro on their side did rather well, but the racing was top-notch throughout the field and Surrey Life came in a satisfactory 14th place out of 35 teams. There were some spills as you might expect, with one racer being temporarily parted with his kart during one incident, but everyone was intact when the chequered flag was waved, so well done to the Daytona team for keeping everyone on the straight and narrow. The biggest news of the night was probably Josh Hill taking the fastest lap title for the event, beating his Formula 1 champion father Damon - that and the fact that the event raised an amazing total of over £20,000 for the halow project.

A great cause

Indeed, although the event is clearly great fun, it also has a serious side in that it aims to raise funds and awareness for this wonderful local charity, which supports

young people with learning disabilities across Surrey. And as the patron of the halow project, who better than Damon Hill to sum up why we should be supporting this great charity?

"When we set up the charity eight years ago, we wanted to make sure that young people with a learning disability have the support they need to live the life they choose as independently as possible," says Damon. "Today, halow helps almost 170 young people across Surrey to do just that, with everything from trips and outings to living in their own home and many things in between. However, they need our support, time, skills and money to help maintain this kind of service."

Of course, Damon's other great passion in life remains motor racing and although, unusually, he started out on motorbikes, he has a great deal of enthusiasm for the entry level motorsport of go-karting. The former world champion is keen to point out that not only is it where most modern F1 drivers started out, but that it's also a great way to get kids active and involved in something rather than being stuck inside
